Expanded Research Focus

- Catastrophes: wind, water, fire, hail
- Full-scale testing of residential, light commercial and farm buildings
- Testing of individual structural components and building systems
- Rigorous data collection and analysis
- Transparent methodology and public release of results
- Real-world applications

Holistic Public Policy Approach

- "Life cycle" of building: land use planning, new construction, retrofits
- Risk-appropriate protection: buffer zones, building codes, code-plus
- Preparedness, response, recovery
- Public and private sector roles
- Variety of local, state, federal enabling mechanisms

Demonstrate realworld effectiveness & life/\$\$\$ value of building strong, safe structures

Scientifically evaluate relative performance of construction materials & techniques

Creating DisasterResistant Communities

Influence public policy at local, state, national levels

Increase supply of superior building components and systems Grow public demand for improved performance of new/existing structures

Insurance Observations

- Lower losses + less volatility + stronger communities = healthier insurance markets
- To enhance mitigation, insurance products must be risk-based and rates adequate
- Public initiatives that ignore risk or allow fraud undermine mitigation
- Evidence-based knowledge as important for insurance as for mitigation
